

THE SOCIETY OF AVIATION AND FLIGHT EDUCATORS 2010 – THE YEAR IN REVIEW

SAFE was formed in 2009 to fill the need for an open, member-centric organization that embraces all facets of aviation education. With member participation as the cornerstone, we continue the organization-building process along two paths: *Infrastructure*, which represents the basis under which SAFE is able to conduct business, and *Outreach*, which represents the services, benefits, and products the organization provides its members in particular, as well as the contributions SAFE makes to the broader aviation community. The following summarizes key accomplishments in 2010:
